EDITORIAL

For the last five years a great deal of time has been spent by both the National Board and Council developing ways to increase the voting at the National AGM, The activities were started at the request of the membership for increased participation.

Postal voting was considered and rejected due the complications and time scales involved. Increasing the number of proxies a delegate can carry to two was also rejected. For the last two AGMs we have experimented by broadcasting the entire proceedings live on the club website with the aim of having on-line voting for those clubs unable to attend the AGM. Once again the proposal was rejected at this

year's AGM. In many cases the vote was very close to the twothirds required but the minority defeat the motion each time.

We have now exhausted all of the possible avenues and five years of work have been wasted. It has been decided therefore that the Harrogate AGM will not be live streamed as the cost is not justified if there is no way to vote.

Five years and we are right back where we started

CHANGES TO THE CLUB ADMINISTRATION SYSTEM (CAS)

Data security has always been of paramount importance in our club database and we have recently commissioned a major upgrade to that security. Consequently there have been some changes that affect how the database is maintained and it is more important than ever that all club contacts ensure that their club's data is kept up-to-date. The following message was recently sent to all club contacts to ensure that they are aware of the situation:

We have recently carried out a security review of our Club Administration System (CAS). It is now ten years old and we need to improve its security to attempt to ensure we prevent any attacks on our system or data. It has always been our policy to protect our database and ensure our members' information is properly secured. No system is impregnable but we must do our utmost to protect your data.

The next time you log on to CAS you will be asked to change your password. In future Passwords must be eight characters long and contain at least two of the following:

A capital letter

A number

A symbol e.g. &*%()

Example:

Showtime41 - this contains a capital letter and two numbers sh0wtime& - this contains a number and a symbol

Should you have forgotten or lost your password you will have the facility to request a password change. The system will send the Club Contact an e-mail with a link to enable the password to be changed. This will be e-mailed to the current Club Contact's e-mail address that is held on the system - hence the importance of keeping the Club Contact's details up to date. You should then click the link and follow the

instructions to change the password. Once complete you will then be diverted to the Log In Screen so you can log in using your new password. You can then use the new password from then on.

Passwords are now stored in our system 'encrypted' - that means no-one can see them, so there is no point in contacting Marchesi House, your National Councillor, the Webmaster, or the National Secretary for your password, as all they can see on the system is a series of ************.

We apologise that this may prove to be inconvenient, but it has been done to ensure your data is kept secure. It is now even more important to ensure the details of the Club Contact are kept updated.

Usernames for Clubs - remain the same.

Also that he is updating the database whenever necessary, adding new members, updating the contact details of those who move house, change their email address etc. and in particular removing the details of deceased members, as we do not wish to cause any additional stress to those that have recently lost a loved one.

Remember if your details are missing or incorrect then you will not get the full benefits of belonging to the organisation.

Recognition for Ernie.



In recognition of his distinguished service to the community local freelance photo journalist Ernie Husson of Llandrindod Wells has been presented with a Certificate of Appreciation and a Silver Kite award of merit.

The presentation was made by the

Chairman of Powys County Council, County Councillor Colonel John Brunt 0.B.E during a special luncheon and reception at Powys County Hall to mark the occasion.

Ernie Husson came to Llandrindod Wells over forty five years ago from South Wales to take over the Marina Gallery Photographers in Llandrindod Wells. Before coming to Llandrindod Wells he had been chief staff photographer to a group of Thompson Newspapers in the Merthyr Tydfil area having covered events such as the Aberfan disaster and sporting events such as boxing matches with the late Howard Winston and Eddie Thomas in addition to general current affairs and various news items.

Councillor John Brunt outlined during the presentation a number of things Ernie had covered in the past and said since coming to the area he had been involved in covering many of the County and local events and was well known throughout Mid Wales for his newspaper coverage.

The chairman also made comment of his involvement with The Association of Ex Tablers Clubs (41 Clubs), where Ernie had been the only Welshman to achieve the honour of becoming the National President of the Association for the United Kingdom in over its sixty years history. Having been involved with the Round Table movement since 1968 he was the founder secretary of the Llandrindod 41 Club.

Howel Roberts, a past chairman of Caernarfon Round Table and 41 Club, was awarded the Order of the British Empire in the 2013 Birthday Honours. The presentation was made by the Lord Lieutenant of Gwynedd at a special presentation last December in the company of family friends.

The medal is awarded for distinguished service to the arts, sciences, public services outside the Civil Service and work with charitable and welfare organisations of all kinds. Howel has a long history of involvement with the Gwyneth Guide Dogs, the RNLI, the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society and Caernarfon Golf Club, along with many other organisations.

He retired as area manager for the HSBC Bank in Gwynedd in 1996, having spent 40 years in branches in North wales and North West England.

The winning photograph in the 2014 competition was by Chris Kean of Ringwood Ex-Tablers, not Chris King as stated.


The errors do prove that I am human!

CLASSIC RALLY 2014 - WILL YOU BE THERE?

been organised over the two days and a fantastic selection of cars have already booked in.

On the Saturday we are fortunate to have the 2014 Rally of The Midlands taking place just a few miles away and we have been invited to attend two of the venues. My special thanks to Richard Hinton of Brownhills and District 41 Club and John Martin of Corby 41 Club for organising the events over the two days. Without them the event would not have taken place.



So to ensure your place fill in the booking form on the back page and send it off right away. It is not often that you get the chance to be part of an inaugural event.

FIFA WORLD CUP 2014 - 41 CLUB STYLE

I'm sure you've already taken part in a few, but unless you were lucky with the draw you have probably already written off your chances (as I have with Costa Rica).

So, why not have a go at this – it will cost you a fiver, but you still stand a chance of winning something even if you do pick out Honduras! Even better, it helps raise money for Anthony Nolan, National President Jim's nominated charity for the year.

You will draw one team from the hat, which will be used in each of the three categories:

MOST ENTERTAINING TEAM AFTER A COUPLE OF BEERS

Your team's entertainment ratio is based on the number of goals scored in their game (for and against), divided by the number of games they play in. A couple of examples:

- Brazil win the trophy having won every group game 2-0 (= 6 goals), and the knock out stage games 1-0 (total of 10 goals). They have played 7 games, so their entertainment average is 1.4285
- Italy on the other hand lose 3-4 to the Uruguay, 0-4 to Costa Rica and 1-7 to England, a total of 19 goals in 3 games obviously much more entertaining, their ratio is 6.333

Most entertaining team of the tournament wins £30, second place £10, third scoops £5. In the event of a tie, winner will be decided by most goals conceded, then most goals scored – if still a tie, prize is shared

DIRTY CHEATING B*STARDS

Points are awarded to your team based on the following, divided by the number of games played:

- Red card -
- Yellow card -
- Each Foul -

30 pts 20 pts 1pt

Dirtiest teams of the tournament win £20, £10, £5 for 1st, 2nd, 3rd

ARE YOU ARGYLE IN DISGUISE?

Awarded to the worst performing team in the finals, based on the following criteria:

- Least points scored in group stage
- · Lowest goals for
- · Highest goals against

Prizes again are £20, £10, £5 for 1st, 2nd, 3rd

This last category can of course be customised to reflect local rivalries.

So you have 9 chances of a cash prize no matter who you draw!

Fouls committed will be taken from the BBC match stats. Goals scored during normal and extra time will be counted, but not from penalty shoot-outs.

The astute amongst you will have spotted that £5 x 32 teams = £160 collected in, but only £115 is paid out in prizes. The remaining £45 goes into President Jim's charity.

I will provide the statistics needed to update the leader boards – all you need to do is record who draws each team and of course collect the money.

The form on the next page can be printed if you want to do the draw "live" at one of your meetings.

For each sweepstake, I will need an email address to mail the updates to – please send them to me at treasurer@41club.org with World Cup Sweepstake in the subject line.

Updates will be sent out after all teams have played once, twice and completed the group stages, then after each knock out round.

The £45 can be paid direct into the 41 Club bank account, sort code 20-07-71, account number 20124494. Please include a reference of your club name, so I can keep track of things (the amount will identify it is from the sweepstake).

If your club isn't large enough to fill the sweepstake, why not combine with a neighbouring one to make up the numbers, or open it up to friends and families. It's entertaining to the end, as a bloodbath / high scoring / low scoring final can change the rankings right up to full time.
