Anthony Nolan - 40/40 challenge your help is needed

Most of you are aware that the Anthony Nolan Trust, a charity dear to our hearts as past Round Tablers, has been my Presidential Charity throughout the year. First of all can I thank those clubs, and individual members, who have either raised money, made donations for my charity badges or arranged 40/40 challenge events. The total collected so far, with known money still to come in is approaching £30,000 so thank you. One of the challenges we put forward at the beginning of the year was the 40/40 challenge to try to help the charity by adding names to the donor register.

I would now like to make a final appeal for your assistance in adding names to the donor register with a specific case in mind. Some of you may have read the tragic story in the Daily Mirror in February of the family where a pair of seven year old twins have both been struck down with Juvenile Krabbe Disease, a terrible disease that quickly ravages the nervous system. This story is also being shared at the moment through our Facebook contacts. They need a stem cell transplant and Anthony Nolan are doing everything they can to find a donor.



I am calling on 41 clubs and all our members to try to use our resources to help. Briefly our 40/40 challenge is to organise an event to create awareness of the work of Anthony Nolan and to encourage young people aged 16-30 to sign on to become a potential life-saving donor. If you haven't it doesn't matter as the objective is to try to get more donors on the register.

many thousands of potential donors are already signing up. Every pound they receive will help with this life-saving work.

As I've travelled the country many of you will have heard me relate the story of Round Table putting 100,000 new names on the register in only 6 weeks in 1986, and what an amazing effort that was. Many of you were in Round Table at that time and were part of that. This is an opportunity to do something extraordinary again.




