

IMPORTANT NEWS REGARDING ACCOMMODATION AT TORQUAY 2019

The HQ Hotel, the Toorak, is already fully booked, but we have secured additional rooms at the Carlton Hotel, which is also owned by THL and is on the same campus. It is a short 2 minute walk from the Toorak, all under cover.

The price is the same at £144 pp for the 3 night package for a twin or double on a B&B basis.

Rooms can be booked by telephone 01803-400500 (+44-1803-400500 from overseas), quoting **booking ID 32305**. Note that you can't book via their website, as that is for public bookings. If you try, you will see that there are no rooms available.

You will be asked to pay a 10% deposit when booking, with the balance due 28 days prior to arrival.

There are numerous other hotels to suit all budgets within easy walking distance of RICC. These can be accessed via the portal

http://www.conferenceenglishriviera.com/booking.php?stage=hotels&event_id=418.

The rates have been negotiated by RICC for us, but of course if you can get it cheaper then go for it.

One thing to be aware of is that there will be **no transport provided by the Conference**. There are hundreds of rooms within easy walking distance of the RICC. If you really want to stay at e.g. The Imperial, then you will need to arrange your own transport.

Round Table Reminisces by Bob Oxley

Part Three

I now wore two hats.



Area Councillor for my Table, and Sales Officer for Area 25, Thames Valley. As ASO, I was expected to attend all Area functions, visit all the 20 plus Tables in the Area at least once during the year, and maximise regalia sales to generate income for the Area. Income was generated from the difference between the sales value and the discounted cost Area obtained on purchases from National.

At my first Area meeting, I made up a pack of badges, cuff-links, ties, and assorted clothing, gave one pack to each Table at a discounted 'sale or return at the next meeting' cost, and offered the same deal on any further purchases up to and including the next Area meeting. No Table present objected, and I made those Tables not represented my first target clubs for a visit. Each pack cost around 25 pounds, (after discount). Three clubs actually bought more at the end of the meeting.

On most visits I was accompanied by members of my own Table, many of whom had never visited another club before. Our greater involvement may have been because we were becoming a more cosmopolitan club, but we really made our mark one Area Sports Day when we introduced 'Marrow Dangling', a game of human skittles. Six players sit on stools in a circle, with plastic buckets on their heads. Eyeholes are cut out of the buckets. In the centre of the circle is a tall pole from which a 'marrow', (a stuffed sausage shaped bag about 2'6" in length), is suspended on a swivel.

Players from the opposing team take it in turns to throw the marrow for one complete revolution without touching the seated players, then score points for every seated player that is hit on a second revolution. Any seated player that 'flinches' is regarded as being hit, and extra points are awarded if a seated player has his bucket knocked off or is knocked off his stool. The thrower must loudly declare 'widdershin' (clockwise), or 'anti-widdershin' (anti-clockwise), and shout 'get stuffed' as he releases the marrow. You couldn't make it up could you? It became so popular that a league was formed, and inter-



Table matches were played at a local pub on Sunday mornings throughout the summer. A great spectacle for the other pub visitors, many of whom came every week just to watch.

As our children grew older, my wife started to get more involved with Ladies Circle. She became Circle chairman the year after my year in the Table chair and she also became more active in Area. I later became Area Chairman. Most of the Tables in my area invited us both to their Ladies Night and some other functions, which we were able to enjoy together. Then in a repeat coincidence, she was elected Circle Area Chairman, so immediately after the excitement and experience of my year, I was unceremoniously relegated again into the 'two steps behind' club.

With hindsight, these were the boom years of Table. I chartered two new Tables in my area, Burnham Beeches and Thatcham. At Burnham I was presented with a scantily clad mannequin, and at the second, the guest of the inaugural chairman offered me a job. I spent the whole of my year visiting other clubs trying to recover my mannequin, travelling throughout the Southern Counties, South Wales and the Thames Valley, only to have her abducted by another club on the night. Great fellowship though!

As Table still had the 40 year age rule, retirement loomed large. The doors to our original 41 Club had not been reopened by the 'born and bred' ex-Tablers, but the second club was flourishing as more Table leavers joined. Out of the blue, I received an unprecedented invitation. I'll tell you about this and the job offer in my next instalment.






Well Worth a Club Visit!


