Welcome to the September Newsletter

What a month September has been - a new Prime Minister, the sad passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and we have a King once more in King Charles III.

Many of our members, myself included, took on the challenge of waiting in line for hours to pay our respects to The Queen - and a worthwhile experience we all found it.

With the passing of The Queen we have entered into a new age - we are no longer Elizabethans but Caroleans. Our outlook should remain to Adopt, Adapt and Improve in the new Age, as much as we and our predecessors have done in the past.

Here are some statistics about our great Association to put it into perspective:-

RTBI currently has 2,750 members.
These are spread amongst 321 clubs.
124 members joined this year and 40 left.
The average age is >36 years old.
714 are over 42.

I can't give you the average age of 41ers because we don't have that information, but I can tell you that we presently have 12,907 members in 682 clubs. Well almost - because this members figure is based upon the number of members in each club (or the declared ones anyway) so if someone is a member of 5 clubs, he will be included 5 times in that figure. To eliminate this overcounting we should deduct say 350 from the total so that would bring us down to 12,557 members (so let's say, 12,500).

To better serve that declining membership we need to carry on Adopting and Adapting and Improving to serve our membership and our movement properly.

41er Stan Holmes celebrated his 102nd Birthday!

Stan was born in Bingley in 1920 the only son of Ben and Ethel. He went to Bingley Grammar School and when he left school he went to work for Midland Bank near Yeadon. He met Hilda his future wife in Bingley.

He volunteered to join the RAF at the start of the war. During his time in the RAF he worked on the repair and maintenance of Spitfires. He was mostly based in the UK but travelled to Berlin towards the end of the war. He went to the Reich Chancellery.

He returned home to Bingley at the end of the war and married Hilda in 1946. They had one son John Stephen. Stan went back to working for Midland bank after the war working in Bradford and Leeds. Stan was a member of Roundtable in Bingley. We don't know if he joined 41 Club in Bingley but he joined Wakefield 41 Club when he moved there in 1969. Hilda was a member of Wakefield Tangent.

He was appointed Manager at Normanton branch with Midland Bank which was then taken over by HSBC. Due to his promotion to Branch Manager at Normanton he moved to Sandal Wakefield in 1969 where he lived until very recently.

Stan and Hilda spent many years travelling visiting South Africa and North and South America. In 2000 they started cruising which they enjoyed enormously and Stan was last cruising in May of this year.

Stan and Hilda celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary in 2016. Hilda sadly passed away in 2017 after a short illness. Stan continued living at the same house looking after himself with very little support. He was a keen user of the internet and this enabled him to remain independent as he did all his shopping including food and banking on line.

Stan celebrated his 100th birthday in July 2020 and despite Covid restrictions was able to have an enjoyable party and received his birthday card from the Queen. He had a lovely party at the care home a few weeks ago for his 102nd birthday.

Stan was a keen amateur photographer and visited various organisations showing slide shows of his many travels. He is a big fan of Frank Sinatra and the big band sound music genre.

Unfortunately in early June he fell at home and as a result he realised he was no longer able to live on his own at home and moved into a local residential home. He has had a couple of falls since but manages to bounce back. He appears to have recovered well from a half hip replacement at 102! It is hoped he will be discharged back to the care home fairly soon.

Larbert & Falkirk 41 - My Name'5 Doddie

Larbert & Falkirk 41 Club were delighted to hand over a cheque for £9,000 to the **My Name'5 Doddie Foundation** at the iconic Kelpies, taking the total raised for good causes since 2017 by the 41 Club to an incredible £69,466.

The charity *My Name's Doddie Foundation* was set up by former Scotland rugby player Doddie Weir and a group of trustees in 2017 shortly after he was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease. Doddie has been driven to help fellow sufferers and seek ways to further research into this, as yet, incurable disease. MND is a disease which affects the motor neurons of the nervous system. It is life shortening and mostly progresses rapidly. The charity's vision is "a world free from MND." The number 5 is a special number for the Foundation, featuring in it's name and is a reference to Doddie's playing number for his clubs, Melrose and Newcastle Falcons, and the jersey he wore when he earned his 61 caps for Scotland.

Larbert & Falkirk 41 Club held a successful fundraiser at the Dobbie Hall in Larbert in May with 240 people attending. Entertainment was provided by the Abba tribute group Voyage and magician Elliot Bibby. Chairman for the 2021/2022 session Mark Northway said 'We would like to thank everyone who has supported us to put on this event. It was great to see so many people enjoying themselves while raising money for a worthy cause and one that has touched my own family. The members of the Club were astounded by the final amount raised, much more than we had anticipated."

Norwich News

This story began, writes Des Fulcher, when I discovered that some plans to redevelop part of the very building where the first official meeting of Round Table was held, which included two separate rooms upstairs being named in honour of key historic figures relative to the building - Firstly the Colman Sisters who funded a lot of the early years of the building which included Suckling Hall, then secondly Louis Marchesi.

Part of the redvelopment plans included a fundraising appeal for shortfall of monies for the project, which I personally made a great deal of effort to engage 41 Club with and Richard King of Norwich RT1 led the way with Tablers in the UK and some International groups too. Whilst the loft of this historic building was being cleared an original signed photo of Louis Marchesi was discovered, the venue suggested it could be auctioned to help raise funds, though I conjured up a better plan to create 50 high quality limited edition prints to ensure the original could remain in the building.

Designers of the new Marchesi Room interior restricted anything being fixed to the walls, the only compromise made was to afford the bespoke cabinet on the stairs with a plaque to acknowledge clubs or individuals who donated £250 or more to the project, leaving the original signed photo without placement.

Despite more dialogue with the venue and Norwich City Council (who own the building) things ground to a halt, then the pandemic emerged which gave further cause for concern to discover where the photo was and

what could happen if Cinema City doesn't continue operating there.

A few weeks back I popped in to tidy up the Round Table Family display cabinet, as luck would have it I met the new Manager Justin Holmes who was eager to re-engage with our organisation - the immediate response was to see if the original photo could be put in the Marchesi Room, which as we now know has finally happened!

Some of the people I would like to mention/thank in this story are: Cinema City Manager Justin Holmes, 41 Club National President Jim Conway, former Lord Mayor of Norwich David Fullman and everyone who supported the Marchesi Room Project .

Round Table Family organisation clubs worldwide are welcome to ask for an informal tour of the key areas in Norwich relative to Round Table being founded, and as ever encouraged to consider sending smaller items of memorabilia to consider adding into the Round Table Family display cabinet.




The National Motorcycle Museum celebrated the 50th anniversary of 41er Norman Hyde's Record Breaking Triumph Sidecar Land Speed Record


On Saturday 24th September, the National motorcycle Museum celebrated the 50th anniversay of Norman Hyde's land speed record on his Triumph Roadrunner III outfit.

Hyde captured the World Sidecar Land Speed Record in 1972, driving his home-built Roadrunner III to an average speed of 161.8 mph at RAF Fairford - a record that remained unbeaten for over 35 years. Norman worked as a development engineer at Triumph's Meriden factory at the time and used his experience to uprate the Triumph Trident engine that powered his outfit, enlarging it to 831cc and adding a supercharger.

Roadrunner III was added to the National Motorcycle Museum's collection in the 1980s, but was one of the hundreds of machines that was severely damaged when fire tore through the building in September 2003. Fortunately the bodywork, handmade in aluminium by Don Woodward, was in storage at the time and survived. The bike itself was painstakingly restored by Don's brother, John, and Roadrunner III is now on permanent display in the Museum.

Norman's anniversary coincides with Triumph's 120th jubilee celebrations and he was at the Museum - 50 years to the day the he broke the record using their engine. The Triumph Owners' Motor Cycle Club organised a ride-in, with a concours competition for their bikes judged by Norman. He gave a talk about his death-defying high speed ride on three wheels, followed by a question and answer session. He will signed original Triumph postcards, made to commemorate the achievement, to raise funds for Prostate Cancer UK.




