#### **AGM Resolutions**

MM stated that there were 4 Resolutions to be considered and went through each one in turn.

Resolution 1 was an 'enabling resolution' to allow Electronic Voting in 2015 if successful at the 2014 AGM.

Resolution 2 was the shortening of the timescales for National Councillor elections and the stopping of postal ballots – allowing the use of more modern communication techniques.

Resolution 3 was the deletion of an out of date rule regarding regional changes.

Resolution 4 had been submitted by Bournemouth 41 Club and proposed the abolishment of National Council. Subsequent to the mailing of the AGM Agenda and Order Paper to all Constituent Clubs an amendment had been received within the 7 day time limit. This amendment had been submitted by Haverhill & District 41 Club and was seconded by Calpe 41 Club. The amendment consisted of changing one word in the original Resolution – replacing the word abolish with review.

There followed a full and comprehensive discussion on the amendment. It was agreed that the National Council was constantly reviewing its structure and purposes. For the sake of brevity only one comment is included – Tom Abbott (TA) – National Councillor Region 19 – stated that as a 'new' National Councillor he had found that we were constantly in the process of review and no National Councillor had obstructed the workings of the National Council.

The options on whether or not to support the Resolution were presented by President Martin and a vote for each taken. The vote found in favour of supporting it. On this TC basis it was agreed that National Councillors' Liaison Officer Terry Cooper (TC) would speak to the motion 'once it became the substantive motion'.

#### 8 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND CHARTERING

President Martin then presented JP with the Charter Certificate for Coventry 41 Club.

JP responded to President Martin stating that there were three Round Tables in Coventry but there had not been a 41 Club. He wanted to be in 41 Club and was pleased the Club had been formed and was now chartered. He said there was more to the 41 AGM and Conference than socialising as witnessed by this Council Meeting.

JS went on to say he was attending the Round Table Conference in May – where he would be doing a Fire Walk - solely for the purpose of raising sponsorship for his Presidential Charity.

#### **IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT** 11

David Smith (DS) - Report as Published.

He said that he had had a fantastic year - one of many great years enjoying the Friendship and Fellowship of the National Council.

During the year he had visited Clubs by request sometimes on behalf of the National President at a cost of £1,500 - £2,000. He had thought that his position was to provide Wise Council when asked – but during the whole year no one had asked anything of him

He did wonder if the position of Immediate Past President was really necessary on TC National Council? He proposed that this item be put on the agenda of the next Forward Planning Committee Meeting.

#### 12 NATIONAL SECRETARY

MM - Report as Published.

He informed the Meeting that not all Club Chairmen had emails, and he had spent a large amount of time phoning Chairmen or, in the case of these individuals not having NCs even a telephone number, 'other' members of that Club. It was time consuming. He asked all National Councillors to help him by ensuring that by next April there would be a Chairman for each Club with a non-bouncing email address.

MM discussed the second phase of video streaming the AGM, with the addition of trialling Electronic Voting. In April all Club Chairman were given an access code to a website that will provide both a video stream of the AGM (in small screen format) whilst screening the proposals, resolutions and elections at the appropriate times during the AGM and asking the Club Chairman to vote.

Comment was made from the floor that inadequate information had been set out.

He had identified 38 target locations for new Clubs for next year.

Swindon 41 Club seems to have disappeared from CAS. David Hewitt (DH) managed to reinstate them.

#### 15 **COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER**

Ray Hill (RH) - Report as Published.

He asked all the Council members to promote the Classic Car Rally.

RH spoke of the inappropriate use of Facebook - there is an investigation into the latest incident - very embarrassing to the Association and opening us up to criminal prosecution.

Phillip Ellis (PE) stated that we are an Association of Clubs and as such it is not a governance issue but a local Club problem. He went on to say that there seemed to be no Round Table Family 'Club' policies. We needed to have a policy in place and develop and undertake Social Media training. The training for Club members should be a 2 year programme suitably titled – 'How to stop yourself being harmed by Social Media'.

PE proposed that he led a team to develop a policy and training package. This did not lead on to any discussion or vote.

Simon Thomas (ST) said that he could see the need for this with the new Website accommodating 800 plus Editors.

JS suggested we make sure we have a co-ordinated approach to all aspects of Social Media alongside web usage.

President Martin stated that he would look into it.
