
## New 41 Club Website Launched

The new 'all singing – all dancing' website for 41 Club went 'live' last week. Developed by Bishop Stortford 41 Club member Simon Thomas's company Toucan Internet, it represents a significant upgrade to our previous site.

Our old site which has been in place for nearly twelve years had become old and tired. It was difficult to edit, written in old technology, and had become extremely dreary to look at.

The new site is bang up to date technology wise. It is colourful, easy to read and easy to navigate around. It is possible for many of the pages to be edited by their owners rather than everything being updated by the Webmaster.



We are able to keep you up to date with 'news' from around the country, show all the events going on, link you to the 41 Club Facebook and Twitter pages as well as having articles and updates of what is going on everywhere. The site is also able to mail our members with information.

The new Website is key to our strategy to curtail falling membership. We know that there are many thousands of former members of Round Table around the country who have never joined 41 Club. Having a bright and dynamic website that is visible to all is an essential tool in raising our profile and hopefully encouraging them to join us. The general public can see only parts of the website as a 'guest' – however if they register – many additional pages become available to them – by registering we are able to capture their details to contact them.

Once the site has been live for a few weeks – and any 'bugs' are ironed out - we will start to launch a

Full details of how to set up the club sites will come out in the next few months – including a guide on how to set them up and maintain them. And the one excellent thing about all of this – the club sites will be FREE!

Past President Arthur Kennedy OBE 1981 – 1982

It is with deep regret that we announce the passing of Arthur Kennedy OBE after a protracted illness on Tuesday 20th January at the age of 90.

Arthur was duly elected National President at the 1981 AGM held in Buxton, Derbyshire and in his inaugural address stated that fellowship and friendship were the main objectives of the Association.

His theme throughout his Presidential Year was one of better communications, improving our Magazine and urging greater participation by the Regional Councillors. Arthur also revived the joint meetings of Club Chairman and fully supported all Cluster Meetings.

He also stressed the importance of giving maximum support to local Round Tables whenever we can, particularly with regard to membership, stating that if Round Table membership declines, ours will surely follow suit tomorrow.

Arthur held the position of Chairman of the London Old Tablers Club three times.

The funeral is booked for 12 noon on Wednesday 18th February at Bournemouth Crematorium. Family flowers only, donations to Arthritis Research UK. There will also be a Memorial Service in London in June but the details for this have not yet been finalised.

### **ANNUAL FORECAST MEETING 2015**

Wensum and Yare 41 Club's 14th Annual Forecast Meeting was held on Monday January 26th at the Wensum Valley Hotel, Norwich. The Guest of Honour and speaker was General The Lord Dannatt, former head of the British Army. We were also delighted to have Jim Smith, National President with us, together with three former National Presidents.

Positioned as an East Anglian Cluster Meeting, 160 members and guests from 16 different Round Tables and 41 Clubs enjoyed dinner whilst they listened to the review of 2014 and then had to try to forecast the outcome of about 30 events in 2015 ranging from the forthcoming election to the Rugby World Cup, set by Wensum and Yare member Martin Sexton.

In his speech Lord Dannatt was very forthright in his forecasts about several sporting, political and business outcomes in 2015. He then adroitly handled a lively question and answer session in which the topics varied from how to deal with Islamic terrorists to the structure of the British Army and the future of Britain's Trident nuclear deterrent.

The evening raised £1700 for General Dannatt's charity of choice, Street Child (<a href="http://www.street-child.com/">http://www.street-child.com/</a>), a charity based in Sierra Leone, set up by Lord Dannatt's son, Tom. A significant donation from the evening will also be made to Jim's charity, The Anthony Nolan Trust.


