NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S CHARITY 2015-16

The National Presidents charity this year is the Stroke Association.

I have chosen the Stroke Association because I have been aware of the tremendous work that they do both to raise awareness of stroke and help stroke survivors for several years. My wife Lin worked for the Stroke Association and I became involved in fundraising events and met stroke survivors who have used the Stroke Associations rehabilitation services. I also chose to support them in memory of Past Tangent President Jan Mulqueen, a great friend of ours who sadly died of a massive stroke soon after last year's National Conference in Bournemouth. I danced and laughed with her at the Final Night party and she was the last person I said goodbye to in the hotel car park as we left for home.

Stroke occurs approximately 152,000 times a year in the UK, that is one every 3 minutes and 27 seconds. Stroke is the fourth single largest cause of death in the UK and it is also the largest cause of complex disability. Having a stroke changes lives – dramatically and suddenly. Stroke can affect anyone of any age from babies right through to the elderly.

I want to raise awareness of the facts about stroke



and the measures that we can all take to prevent having a stroke and I want to raise money to help the Stroke Association with the brilliant services that they provide to stroke survivors and their continuing commitment to stroke research.

Sadly last year our good friend Jan Mulqueen, past Tangent President, suffered a fatal stroke and at this year's conference another 41er suffered a stroke whilst travelling to conference. A stroke happens every three and a half minutes in the UK. I want to raise awareness of stroke and how we can prevent it and I want to raise money to help the Stroke Association continue with the work that they do on all fronts.

No sooner had the dust settled on Harrogate than we were packing our bags for warmer climes. We travelled to the 41 Club International AGM in Limassol, Cyprus with a large contingent of around 50 from the UK.

Another excellent event ably organised by our friends in Cyprus 41 Club. The weekend commenced with a Cyprus Night held in the garden of one of the 41ers with plenty of food, wine and music. We were treated to traditional Cypriot dancing along with belly dancing and glass balancing and of course Zorba's dance. THE LAST BRITISH DAMBUSTER MADE AN HONORARY MEMBER OF 41 CLUB



Johnny is the last surviving member living in the UK of the famous "bouncing" bomb raids made on the three major dams in Germany during May 1944.

Over 120 members of 41 Club were privileged to hear Johnny, an amazing 93 years old, give an enthralling and emotional account on the bombing mission which helped to shorten the Second World War.

Johnny has spoken to several 41 Clubs in Region 21 enabling clubs to raise funds for Anthony Nolan and 617 Squadron Association. To mark our appreciation Johnny was presented with an Anthony Nolan 41 Club pin badge and made an Honorary member of our Association in Region 21.


