GREAT RESPONSE TO MEMBERS' ON-LINE SURVEY




Four weeks ago we contacted all members for whom we have an email address and asked if they would participate in an on-line survey to help us plan the future of 41 Club. This is the first stage of the exercise, promised at the 2015 AGM, to consult members and clubs as to where they want the club to go in the future.

Previous attempts at club questionnaires had received poor responses and it was thought that we may receive a limited response this time. How wrong we were! As I write this newsletter we have received just short of 1,800 completed

surveys and the number is still growing daily. Many thanks to those that have completed the survey but we would still like to receive more opinions. The survey is completely anonymous and consists of ten questions. Completing the survey takes less than 10 minutes.

Which age group are you?

Answered: 1,724 Skipped: 49



On the left you can see the current analysis of question 1. It shows that the largest group of respondents are in the age group 66 to 75 and confirms the general feeling about the age profile of 41 Club.

We definitely need more input from the younger age groups.

The survey also dispels the often quoted belief that those over a certain age do not use PCs or the Internet. Over 13% of responses are from members 76 or older.

We will keep the survey open for another two weeks so if you have not completed it already then you still have the opportunity to help influence the future of 41 Club.

Once the survey has closed the data will be analysed and used as the basis for discussions with a selection of clubs that have volunteered to attend a workshop and will be made available to all members.

My thanks also to those members that have volunteered to participate in future more targeted surveys. If you would like to be added to this group then please send your name and email address to comms@41club.

HUGE FOLLOWING ON OUR NEW WEBSITE

Since the launch of our brilliant brand new Website (www.41club.org) in January, we have been carefully monitoring its success and I am pleased to report that things are looking really good!

Although our membership is over 45 and in many cases a lot more than that, it is encouraging to see that the largest number of visits (60%) come from the 18-34 age group. This proves its worth in looking for potential members from Round Table. It also means that 41 Club is being looked at by many people of all age groups.

Of the 2,607 visitors 88% come from the UK, the rest are spread around the world. Interestingly there were nine visitors from China!

Our old site was visited 52 times a day – our new one is attracting 137 visitors a day – a massive improvement. In all during the first six months it was visited 21,189 times!

Even more encouraging is that we have 37 potential new members as a result of them filling in the 'Want to Join?' section on the site.

www.41club.org is a very powerful website. It allows Clubs to have their own website with the same look and feel as the National site. So far 35 Clubs have set up, or are in the process of setting up, their Club sites. This is a free service and all the tools are in place to make it relatively easy to achieve.

The site is also a mine of information on what is happening and what is needed for running our Association and our Clubs. If you think we need to add something – please do not hesitate to ask.

However there is always room for improvement! We always lack material as to what you are all doing! If you stage an event that is worthy of mention – just email a short article and a picture to webmaster@41club.org. Nothing fancy is needed, just some text in any format! Most of us have cameras on our 'phones so it's not that difficult! See if you can make the front page with your event! Or perhaps one of your members has done something outstanding or interesting lately – let's let everyone hear about it!

The experts tell us that if you visit a website a second time – and it is exactly the same as when you looked last time – you will not visit it again. We need to keep ours interesting and fresh all the time to maintain and increase our visitor numbers.

There has been much controversy this year over this website, many of it very negative. It's important to believe we have a very powerful tool here that is being visited and used by potential and existing members. Those potential members from Round Table are nowadays very 'Social Media conscious'—so it is important we remain attractive in this area to increase our membership.

Gentlemen, we really do have a real success on our hands here – let's capitalise on it!

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

I would also state that my speech to the 41 Club AGM in the afternoon was obviously missed by many, during which I shared the current and future plans and asked the members of 41 Club to stop being negative on a club that the current members are very proud of and working very hard in every community.

I would also like to state my disappointment at the fact in the notice and agenda for this year's AGM there was reference "to the demise of Round Table" by a past president.

Round Table is fitter, leaner and stronger, more than ever before.

Why you may ask?

The results are due to the action we have taken action over the last five years, we have a clear strategy which seems to be falling on deaf ears. It is the perception of 41 Club members that we are failing because of the "in my day attitude", maybe if members of 41 Club who think Round Table was in demise actually introduce members to Round Table we would be thriving even more.

Yes thriving!

I would like to share with the members some of the overarching plans we are currently engaged with.

We are half way through a ten-year strategy and the next 12 months to 3 year plan and our focus is to make Round Table generational.

The plan is structured into three areas;

Engaging with our current members.

We have launched a plan that includes 17 regional members forums this year alone that will engage, educate and encourage, we are using new communications channels, we are working on new channels of communication for example launching RTTV, we have launched round table training academy with a view to get professional accreditation for our members who especially those who stand up to be our chairman.

We have moved forward with a demographic plan of the UK, today we know the 200 towns in RTBI where Round Table will be successful, the demographic report highlights a real strategic plan and question - do we need more clubs or more members and the answer is simple depends on the regions.

We are supporting the clubs who need our help with clear actions supported by a structure change in the board, we now have a new role that supports programme development and a new board role that supports community-an area that is at the very core of what we do.

We now have more support in HQ for our members.

Feeder Clubs for our future members.

Round Table Business Clubs are being created with a view

they will support local businesses by becoming locally famous but more importantly these clubs will be chartered with the aims and objects to support the development of a new generation of members by supporting these clubs with lectures, advice and more importantly signing up to a apprentice program/job board scheme , these clubs will support our plans for growth. Engaging with a new generation that will in the future support all clubs in the future.

We are making these plans, we are investing in the future, we are making a difference.

Business partnerships that will help our members and their families.

The member's benefits project will add value to what our members get for being a member, from education to programme opportunities for today's members, we have contacted over 25 national companies that will add real value, to support our structure we have a new business development manager.

These actions are the overarching plans and there is a belief and determination by all the members and the association has just been awarded "Association of The Year" by the EMA of Round Table International for our strategy work and the fact we have become the market leaders in RTI.

Summary

I hope this clear and concise note paints the correct picture for your members and I would ask anyone who says Round Table is not thriving to challenge those individuals with this article or point them in my direction.

Round Table is changing, our members are joining at a younger age 32 on average today, clubs are growing and there is a belief that Round Table that we are more relevant in the communities of today.

Round Table means different things to different people, for some it will be community for others it will be charity for the most it will be the fun and friendships for life - and we know this and we are celebrating our DNA.

Our members are the "Ordinary Guys Doing Extraordinary Things" for others every day of the year in your communities, tell these members that we are failing, I think your members will get a response that will challenge that.

One final point only 18% of Round Table members are joining 41club - why?....that point I will leave for you and your members to discuss, but I will make one point that I stated above.

Our aim is to make Round Table generational and our members are determined to be in control of their own destiny and that gents is a project I will support with the same determination.

41 Club - Classic Car Rally South 19th and 20th September 2015

Following the success of the 2015 Classic Rally recently held at Shrigley Hall we are currently planning another Classic Rally this time to be held in the south of the country in Bedfordshire.

The event will be based around the Cross Keys Public House in the village of Pulloxhill where Ampthill 41 Club have held our meetings for the last 30 plus years.

The event will take place over the weekend of the 19th and 20th of September. The basic plan is to meet at the pub on Saturday morning, visit Woburn Abbey in the afternoon, hold a dinner and social event in a marquee behind the pub in the evening and visit Shuttlewoth to see the famous Shuttleworth Collection and Swiss Garden on the Sunday.

COMMUNITY SERVICE IN 41 CLUB

Some may be aware that one of the four Purposes and Objects of 41 Club is "To encourage active involvement in the Community". It has always been a debate as to what form that should take and many clubs firmly believe that they did their community and fund-raising bit in Round Table and don't want to be involved any more. Many other clubs do however, decide to do some activities. The photo below of Larbert & Falkirk 41 Club arriving at Land's End illustrates this.

Research done by National Council over the past few years has given a strong indication that "active involvement in the community" is of great benefit to clubs for recruitment of retiring Tablers. All members of Round Table are actively involved in their communities and as they reach that magic age of 45 most of them don't want to stop. A recent survey of Round Tables showed that in the year to April 2015 Round Table raised over £2 million for charities, but not only that they continue to run many other events from Fireworks to Beer Festivals and many other fun events in their communities.

In June this year recognising the importance of involvement in the community Round Table restored the position of Community Service Officer on the National Board and Andrew Simmonds of Bristol Round Table was appointed to the role. At the 41 Club Council meeting in June Council gave the approval to 41 Club developing a Community Service strategy to work in tandem with Round Table. Let me emphasise that this is not in any way a compulsory role for 41 Clubs but purely voluntary. Just looking at the research we believe it is not only beneficial for our communities but beneficial for 41 Club membership, attracting retiring Round

Tablers. A further example of the benefit comes from our colleagues in 41 Club Germany who embarked on this approach some eight years ago. At the time they made the decision they believed the transfer rate from Table to 41 Club was around 25%, which we believe is very similar to that in the UK now. By adopting a CS strategy, and in particular working with Round Table, the transfer rate had risen to 83% last year. Many other International Associations are adopting this strategy.

As Immediate Past President I have taken on the role on behalf of the National Council. I am now looking for clubs, or members of clubs, from different parts of the country to help me in developing a suitable approach to this. If you or your club want to be involved in the discussions please contact me at pastpresident@41club.org. I look forward to hearing from you.
