Many thanks to all members that completed the recent 41 Club on-line survey. The response has been overwhelming and far exceeds any exercise in the past. A total of 1,891 members completed the questionnaire from the 11,640 notified via email. This represents a 16.25% response rate from those that we were able to contact and around 11% of the total declared membership.


The survey has produced some very interesting results. Many confirm the beliefs that many have about the current and future makeup of the Association, but there are also a few surprises. The age profile shows confirms that we are an ageing club with many members beyond retirement age. The number of members in clubs shows quite a lot with healthy figures but we must temper this with the fact that many in the very small clubs probably do not accept email or answer questionnaires.




WIN A DRIVING EXPERIENCE & HELP A CHILDREN'S HOSPICE

HELPING DISABLED RAMBLERS

The Disabled Ramblers run about 50 rambles a year spread across England and Wales. So far this year we have been to Cumbria, North York Moors, Cannock Chase, New Forest, Cotswolds, Pembrokeshire, Richmond Park, Malvern Hills and now, thanks to the work of the 41 Club, the Easy Access Route linked to the Millennium Way in Worcestershire. Yet to come are rambles in Suffolk, Norfolk and Derbyshire.

Way back in 1992 our founder, Dr Mike Bruton MBE, organised the first ramble for disabled people using wheelchairs and electric scooters when 10 members covered 40 miles of the Ridgeway over a weekend through heavy rain and this mud. As the number of members grew, the distance covered each day reduced and now our rambles are between 5 and 8 miles long. Using mobility scooters which are designed for off-road use, we are able to cover a wide range of difficult situations — and some our members love to see how far they can push themselves, last year a couple of members tackled the Land Rover test track at Eastnor Castle! We can tackle 1:4 hills and 1:4 cross-slopes, steps of 5" and water 6" deep using the Tramper which was designed with the help of one of our members — Robin Helby.


The early rambles were before the rights of the less able to access the countryside was recognised by most people in authority and many battles had to be fought at Government level before changes began. Members of the Disabled Ramblers were instrumental in the publication of Natural

England's guidance to countryside managers – "By All Reasonable Means". This sets out our position that we are not looking for the countryside to be covered in Tarmac, quite the opposite. We simply ask for the removal of man-made obstacles – steps, stiles and locked or too-narrow gates.

There are thousands of miles of footpaths across the countryside but only a relative few are accessible to the less able. While many stiles are now coming down, they are often replaced by gates which are too narrow so we still have a lot of work to do in educating the decision makers that the less able — and those with baby buggies - just need a bit of consideration to enable them to enjoy the countryside. We are very pleased that this has been recognised by the 41 Club working with Worcestershire County Council to open up a delightful circular ramble between Broughton Hackett and White Ladies Aston. The seven members of the Disabled Ramblers who took part in the opening ramble thoroughly enjoyed the day and would like to thank all involved in making it possible especially John Armstrong from the 41 Club and Amanda Hill from Worcestershire CC Rights-of-Way.




