# FESTIVE FUNDRAISERS NET £500,000 AS ROUND TABLE SANTAS WORK OVERTIME!



Round Table Santas have covered more than 3,400 miles and totalled up more than 1,000 nights out in December as they raised more than £500,000 for good causes this month.

More than 150 Round Table clubs and their army of volunteer elves have taken to the streets of Britain bringing Christmas cheer in the long-standing festive tradition.

Months of preparation – from building sleighs to planning routes and volunteer schedules – have come to fruition with outstanding results, following a first ever Santa Sleigh survey by the National Association of Round Tables Great Britain and Ireland.

In addition to spreading joy around dozens of neighbourhoods, Round Table volunteers have played a vital role in their communities this festive season visiting hospitals, schools and residential homes.

The fundraising efforts around the country supports hundreds of community groups and initiatives, many of whom also play a role in joining the Santa sleigh collections.

Newcastle Round Table handed 200 selection boxes to children at Royal Victoria Infirmary – one of three charitable efforts in one day, while Plymouth Round Table have donated survival kits to the city's Shekinah Mission.

Barry Round Table successfully campaigned its community for volunteers to keep its sleigh running this year, while Winchester Round Table took to the streets for the first time – having spent months refurbishing an old milk float.

Each sleigh is run entirely by volunteers, who cumulatively have donated more than 1,000 nights this month.

Andrew Simmonds, Community Development Officer for Round Table said: "This is an outstanding contribution from our members, who are at the core of every community across the country.

"Santa Sleigh collections are one of the most difficult but rewarding projects that our members and the clubs undertake each year. An enormous amount of effort goes into organising each and every one with many of members out for two to three hours each night straight after a day at work.

"They do it in all weathers to spread some Christmas cheer. You only have to see the smiles on the hundreds of children that see Santa to know how rewarding all the effort is.

"In addition, we also raise an incredible amount of money that will benefit various community groups, causes and charities from the New Year and beyond."

Round Table, which was founded in 1927, is the leading social and voluntary organisation for men aged 18-45 in Great Britain and Ireland.


Last year, Round Table clubs raised over £2.1 million throughout the year for causes across the UK.


Any member of 41 Club is welcome to attend as an observer (subject to space being available).

#### CHRISTMAS AT 'THE LAMB'

68 members of the Round Table Family attended the annual Christmas get-together at The Lamb Tavern in Leadenhall Market in the City of London.

'The Lamb' has now been meeting every month for the past 29 years and is a 'drop in club' for members of the Round Table Family. It meets every month at lunchtime on the second Wednesday of the month. The event is organised by a number of members of Clubs including LOTS.

The Christmas meeting attracted a collection of people including many Past National Presidents and past and existing Officers of both 41 Club Round Table and Tangent. Attendees travelled from far and wide including a member of Berlin 41 Club.

The Lamb Tavern, first built in 1309 by Sir Hugh Neville, is situated at the heart of Leadenhall Market.

The original building had a large lead roof hence the name Leadenhall, and although it's not certain it was built as a public place- by the end of the 14th century it was firmly established as a market and for many years was the site of the City granary. Unfortunately, the original Leadenhall was badly damaged in the Great Fire of 1666 and

was rebuilt in its present form by Sir Horace Jones. It continued to function as a market as the majority of the traders were fishmongers and butchers and even today there remains a butcher in Central Avenue

Efficiently organised as usual by LOTS Vice-Chairman David Leon, after fellowship in the Lamb Tavern, everyone went for a Christmas Meal in the nearby Loch Fyne Restaurant.

David Leon announced at the meeting, after receiving a badge and banner from National President Terry Cooper, that 'The Lamb' would be celebrating its 30th year next year – at a time when he would be Chairman of LOTS. David also presented Terry with a Lamb badge.

In October, 41 Club Regions 8 (Lancs & Manx), 11 (Cheshire & NW Midlands) and 12 (North Wales) played a part in supporting a Charity Dinner organised by Wirral Community Police Boxing Club in Ellesmere Port, the aim of which was to raise funds to allow the Club to buy the premises where it is based.

The Club released the following statement in early December:

#### **PRESS RELEASE**

Wirral CP Boxing Club are celebrating after winning their toughest fight. In March, the owners of the property where their gym is based in Little Sutton, Ellesmere Port, informed the club that they wanted to sell, and that the club had until December to raise £80,000 to purchase the property or we would be made homeless.

The club, who were established thirty-five years ago, were now in serious danger of ceasing to exist. Faced with this ultimatum the club had no choice but to come out fighting. Chairman Peter Phelan said "this club means too much, to too many people to have thrown in the towel".

The club, who became registered charity, launched a fund raising campaign, and over the past nine months, members, their families and friends have organised and took part in a variety of events to raise money. These have included, abseiling down a lighthouse, packing shopping in

supermarkets, taking part in fun runs, bike rides, swimming lakes, jumping out of planes and spending the weekend sat in a bath full of baked beans. In addition, twenty members successfully completed the gruelling 3 Peaks Challenge.

Peter Phelan said "to witness the commitment of our members, and the generosity of family, friends and the public during our campaign has been an inspiring and humbling experience, and highlights the importance of this club to the community"

Due to their endeavours, and with support from local businesses and organisations the club have managed to achieve their target. The money raised will allow the club to purchase the property and secure their future for the benefit of the community. Peter Phelan said "this is an incredible achievement and the club would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who supported us during our campaign"

However, amid the celebrations, Peter Phelan added a note of caution "Although we have secured our future in the short term, we continually need to raise funds to meet the day to day running costs of the club to guarantee our long term future, which is why we are appealing to potential sponsors and the local business community to help in any way they can"
