8 ICT Report PE

The National Councillors' Liaison Officer Phillip Ellis (PE) tabled the report as issued and opened it for discussion.

National Councillor Region 17 Des Fulcher (DF) asked if there was cohesion between CAS and the website. Vice President Barry Durman (BD) answered



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that CAS is not updating the website. GS stated that the website cannot update the website due to the need for an API Bridge which had been discussed and agreed at an earlier meeting. There is an incapability between them.

TC stated that he did not want to wait any further, it was an embarrassment to the Association.

DF stated that the website was over engineered – will the proposed API Bridge cause a knock on?

TC replied that CAS is 13 years old, it is envisaged that there would be a CAS2 in the future, until then we need to fix CAS1, the new website works, we just need them to link together and work together. This should not cause any adverse knock ons.

DF proposed that we focus on our database – we need to communicate with our members.

National Councillor Region 20 Derek Knowlden (DK) proposed that we allocate a amount up to £1,000.00 to repair the ABI bridge. Seconded National Councillor Region 23 David Brown (DB).

National Secretary Manny Martins (MM) stated his report was as printed. Additionally he had received a late nomination for the post of National Councillor Region 3 – Ireland from Stewart Thompson of Dublin 41 Club. MM proposed that this late nomination be accepted therefore filling this vacant post. Seconded MF.

National Treasurer

MF stated that his report was as published on the website.

MF asked if any his proposed budget cuts were to be actioned?

GS said that we needed to keep the Magazine.

The National Councillors' Liaison Officer Phillip Ellis (PE) said that we needed funding to educate the National Councillors and the movement as a whole. There was a need to develop a Training Manual and distribute it. Selected members of Clubs needed to be invited to attend training sessions. He thought that Club Vice Chairman training would be useful & similar to what Round Table did.



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TC said that in 2017 we needed to budget for this.

DF said that funding was necessary to search for and identify new National Councillors and Assistants.

PE said we needed to communicate more, for instance there was no representative from Scotland at the meeting.

National Councillor Region 25 John Alford (JA) said that he was not into Twitter or Facebook but with training that could be different.

SM stated that Round Table had a training programme where 4 classes were running simaltaneously allowing trainees to be instructed in smaller numbers and rotate classes.

10 RTBI President Marcus Jones (MJ)

MJ

MJ announced that RTBI had joined the NCVO opening up the possibility of funding up to a maximum of £400,000. This also aligned them with 11,000 other organisations.

MJ proposed that 41 Club and RTBI invest in a shared database that would contain accurate information about our members.

MJ said that he taken an initiative of contacting 1,100 ex-Round Tablers.

84% had responded.

64% had brought in 1 or 2 new members.

10% had brought in 10 or more.

Only 15.46% joined 41 Club on leaving Round Table.

90% were still involved in Round Table.

The majority say that there should be a middle club (we call them Active Clubs) along the lines proposed by 41 Club a number of years ago (then



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called Marchesi Clubs).

379 Tablers retire next year, 379 the year after, and, finally 692 in year 3.

It had been decided to change the format of saying goodbye and thanking retiring Round Tablers. The response from the ex-Tablers was that they were angry about being dropped by Round Table by email and letter. They were resentful. So it is proposed to hold a Graduating Ceremony to say goodbye.

RT are launching a new initiative which was to start Round Tables in Uni's in the 18–22 year old group – the only drawback being that Uni's are co-ed.

At present there are 1,473 Honorary's in Round Table and it is being considered to charge them the full subscription charge.

The Round Table Executive work 40 hours a week on behalf of Round Table, they have held 17 Forums around the UK and have recruited 470 new members so far this year.

MJ said that in 2020 Round Table would be reviewing the age rule, looking to reduce it back to 40.

The average age of a new Round Tabler joining is 31.2 in some Areas it is 27 and they are therefore having many more years in Round Table than previously. A current Table Chairman has on average only been in Round Table for 3 years.

National Councillor Region 4 Colin Steen (CS) said that by charging membership of Honorary members it is legitimising their position and they will never leave Round Table.

National Councillor Region 13 Steve James (SJ) said we should be working with Round Table to get the Honorary's out of Round Table and into 41 Club.

DK asked if there was a rule regarding Honorary's in Round Table.

MJ answered that the rule was 6 including the Round Table President.

GS asked if MJ should show leadership by joining 41 Club.





MJ stated that he will, of course, be joining 41 Club.

TA said that we should listen to what retiring Ex-Round Tablers say. One of his 41 Clubs had started a new younger 41 Club for its retirees.

11 Board Reports Continued National Membership Officer

(DK stated that his report was as printed. He discussed the different levels of progress on the Prospectives Database by individual National Councillors. DF proposed they left it to clubs to undertake on their own behalves. He was informed that last year the National Councillors had proposed that Clubs were not up to it and they would do it themselves. KC proposed that DK email all the National Councillors and ask them if they required any assistance to complete this task by the end of the Association year.

Magazine production costs are down to lower than 5 years ago. RH has had an approach from a publisher who wanted to print our magazine at a lower cost than at present. RH intended to try them out on a one off basis to evaluate their performance and costs.

RH reported that the next edition of the Magazine would be the last one carrying Obituaries' (which are edited and produced by the Honorary Archivist Hugh Milward (HM)). In future the 'Book of Remembrance' on our website would be available for Club Editors to upload their own Club Members obituaries and comments on their and other Member's obituaries.
