welcome party, Saturday entertainment and food, and Sunday Inter-Club activities. Additional nights for those wishing to stay longer can be booked directly with the site.


To be sure of your pitch in the main Rally field we advise you to return your booking form asap.



Frank Bull (National President 1987 - 1988) received his British Empire Medal at a presentation with the Duchess of Northumberland.


Frank and his daughter Ruth have also been invited to visit Buckingham Palace on the 15th of May.

Round Table Reminisces by Bob Oxley

Part Four

Did he just offer me a job?

I was sat on the top table at an inaugural Charter Dinner, having just presented the charter to the chairman of a new Table. My wife and I had been in conversation with one of his friends,

and the friend had just given me his business card and told me call him as he wanted to offer me a job. I told him politely that I already had a job, but thanked him anyway.

A few weeks later, following a restructuring of the sales force, I was made redundant. I was devastated! It soon became obvious that, even though not yet 40, I was considered too old or 'too experienced' for recruitment to a similar role elsewhere. Where was that business card? The geographical location of the job proved impractical, but ironically a similar life changing vacancy appeared in my local paper. I decided to go for it, at least until I found 'something more suitable'.

I managed to get through the Area Smoker, dodging the contents of thrown plastic beer 'glasses' and

the advances of the strippers, clearly intent on getting their hands on my chairman's jewel! I didn't do too well in the Area Boat Race. One of our Tablers, an engineer, designed us an unsinkable boat, constructed from planks and oil drums containing ballast. We set off in our heat with the others, but it was so hard to row or punt, that the organisers gave up on us after everyone else had finished, and started the next heat. All the competitors in that heat raced past us and finished. Eventually everybody boarded us, and responding to the cheering and provocation of the crowd, finally managed to prove that we were not unsinkable after all. We all got very wet.



My year ended on a massive high. As usual, my Table took part in the annual Pedal Kart Grand Prix organised in our area on part of one of the country's



national racecourses. There were races for both Circlers and Tablers, with prizes for the best presented team and kart, as well as the winners of both the Final and Plate competitions. Our engineer's kart design was rejected in favour of one built by our dentist member. Incredibly, both my Table and our Circle swept the board, winning both Finals and being awarded first prize for the best turned out team and kart.

More and more of us started to go to National Conference, the highlight of which was the final night party. We were still in the sticker era, when the main objective was to see how close you could stick your Table's message to the sensual body parts of a member of the opposite sex.

Great fun in the intoxicated atmosphere of the final night party, but hellish helping my wife remove them. Reading them, I thought, OK, maybe 'No one can lick 'em like Wycombe', but the anatomical geography of a 'Nottingham North nipple nibbler' was a bit worrying, finding two curly hairs still attached to his sticker!

A Memory of Ken Dodd

I was lucky enough to be President of Wallasey Round Table 220 – Wallasey's No.1 man was President not Chairman – in 1974/5, our 25th Charter Year. We held three celebration events. A black tie Charter Dinner, of course, with Brigadier Sir Douglas Crawford, first Lord Lieutenant of the new County of Merseyside, as principal guest and speaker; we hosted a meeting of Area 36; and, towards the end of the Table year, an informal fish and chips comedy evening.

This last event was held in a room at New Brighton Bathing Pool which, when it was built in the first half of the twentieth century, was the largest pool complex in the UK, possibly in the world. Sadly, it is now gone. We invited Tablers and their guests from all nearby Tables. I had earlier met a man who was a top administrator in Liverpool theatres and when I mentioned this prospective event to him and said we wanted one or two good comics, his response quite took me aback. He said Ken Dodd would just have finished doing pantomime



in Liverpool and he was sure he could get Ken to be our star turn. Ken would also find the warm up comedian and all for an acceptable fee! And....so it worked out!

The first comedian, obviously also a scouser (but whose name I forget), went down very well. And then, just as we were beginning to get anxious, Ken arrived and was met outside by my friend David Highet who was about to show him to the small dressing room by passing through the audience. But Ken recoiled, saying he couldn't possibly see the audience before the show so they went a long way round! He was clearly on edge, asking how the first comedian had gone down and saying he hadn't done a stag do for many years! He then asked to be left alone for 15 minutes or so. Dave later reported that when eventually he ushered Ken to the speaking area, he noticed that he had joke reminders written all over his hands!

Needless to say, Ken Dodd was wonderful – hilariously funny though not blue, and went on far longer than expected, as he always did. And when the event had finished, he was quite happy to stay and have a drink or two with the organising committee; to chat quite normally but also to reduce us again to stitches! A very happy memory of a lovely man.

This is a fantastic scheme if you like to get discounts off many of your day to day purchases at many national retail stores and



restaurants. I always say that members have to be rich or bonkers not to use this scheme! All you have to do is use our special code (S424698A) to set up an account on-line and decide which stores you shop at on a regular basis. You ask for a card for each shop and pay £1.59 postage regardless of how many cards you request.

Once you get your cards (within 48 hours) you can then load them with cash. For example you load £100 onto your Sainsbury's card and the system charges you £96.50 because you get 4.5% discount. Discounts vary from around 4% to 10%. Personally I save exactly my 41 Club subs each month by buying £300 at Sainsbury's for £286.50, then I also load smaller amounts onto Marks and Spencer, Boots and Pizza-hut cards. Once you have the card loaded with money, your partner can also use it, so it's brilliant and a real monetary benefit to being a 41 Club member.
