

WELCOME TO THE 41 CLUB MEMBERS' HANDBOOK

Welcome to the 41 Club members handbook which introduces you to key information regarding 41 Club, such as purposes and objects, inducting a new member, regional contacts, together with a list of all of the member benefits discount schemes.

41 Club is a network of approximately 650 mens' clubs across Great Britain and Ireland (GB&I) with over 11,000 members with a focus on fun, friendship and community projects. Established almost 80 years ago, 41 Club is open to men aged 41+ who are looking to join in fun activities, make friends and contribute to the local community. It is also part of a wider International 41 Club in 27 countries around the world.

In recent years as the age profile of GB&I 41 Club has increased, there have also been a growing number of 'Extended Round Table' or XRT Clubs started, which provide a continuation of Tabling activities for those leaving under the 45yr age rule who have not been able to join a local established 41 Club for whatever reason or are already members of an existing 41 Club but want to create an additional younger age profile Club within the 41 Club Association. The XRT rondel is a merger of Round Table and 41 Club rondels - as shown at the top of this page, though in this handbook, '41 Club' applies generically to both.

- Increasing Membership is always a high priority for our Association. We have the XRT initiative, which is now gathering momentum and resulting in even more Round Tablers joining our Association.
- During this coming year, we plan to organise Membership Roadshows across
 the Association and I encourage your Club to attend one nearest to you. We as
 an Association are not used to recruiting members from outside the RT Family
 we did it in Round Table and we need to start recruiting within 41 Club now.

Above all, we are a Fun and Friendship Association – so in whatever you do, make sure you enjoy it!

NEW MEMBER INDUCTION

New members are the life blood of our Association, so it's important we make them feel very welcome when they formally join 41 Club.

This Induction ceremony is important and consequently should be undertaken with a degree of seriousness and solemnity with Club members standing, and wearing jackets, if the dress code is formal. Members should charge their glasses with an appropriate drink prior to this, ready to toast to the new member.

The Induction should be carried out by the Club Chairman / President, however should a National Councillor or a member of the National Board be present – it is usually courtesy to invite them to carry this out.

The Club should ensure that a new 41Club badge is available for the ceremony. At an appropriate time the new member should stand next to the Chairman / President, who should say:

"Gentlemen please be upstanding - [Name] further to your previous attendances it has been agreed that you should be formally invited to join in membership of [Name of Club].

Your acceptance of membership carries with it an obligation to uphold the Purposes & Objects of our Association, which is a member of the Round Table Family of Clubs.



NEW MEMBER INDUCTION (CON'T)

The Purposes & Objects of 41 Club are:-

- 1 To continue to promote opportunities for fun and fellowship amongst former members of Round Table. (This wording will be reviewed, subject to Members' formal approval.)
- To encourage active involvement in the community.
- 3 To use our experience in support of the Round Table Family
- 4 To encourage international relationships

Do you accept this obligation? [Response: Yes, I do]

Then in the name of our Association and of [Name of Club] I welcome you into our fellowship. The presentation of this badge [present the badge or place on suit lapel] is now a symbol of your connection with a world-wide Association of thousands of like-minded men.

Wear this badge at all times, and remember as you wear it, that you carry the good repute of 41 Club into all that you do - for this Association is judged by those who recognise you as a member.

Fellow members – please be upstanding. I commend [Name] to you and ask you to drink a toast to him and remind you that the obligation he has accepted today is an obligation of which you should be equally mindful, for it binds you together in life long fellowship."

After the toast members of the Club should applaud, and the new member may feel it appropriate to say a few words.



YOUNG AMBASSADORS PROGRAM



The YAP seeks to promote exchange visits between young adults between the ages of 18 and 25.

Objectives of these visits are the following:

- 1 Exposing young adults to different cultures, lifestyles and histories
- 2 Building friendships and close relationships across continents
- 3 Developing confidence, trust and international understanding

Requirements to be an ambassador:

You must be between 18 and 25 years of age and familiar with the idea of international friendship as promoted by 41 INTERNATIONAL and Old Tablers. You have a working knowledge of English and are able to express yourself in the language of the host country.

You are prepared to travel along wherever required.

Selection

The selection of the candidates is based on the following criteria:

The candidate must be:

- Aware of the idea of international friendship as promoted by 41 INTERNATIONAL and Old Tablers.
- 2 Have good academic record
- 3 Able to pay for the trip to and from the country of visit
- 4 Physically and mentally fit
- (ambassador) not only of their club and city but their country as well.

There are four honorary members of the National Council:


- The Honorary Solicitor, the Honorary Archivist, the Honorary Webmaster and the YAP Convenor



DATA PRIVACY GDPR Statement

To enable us to validate and maintain your membership an amount of personal data will be processed to ensure:

- your right to join the National Association of ex-Round Table Clubs (41 Club)
- your continued membership of 41 Club.

This data will be processed using both consent and contractual obligation as the legal basis for processing under the General Data Protection Regulation 2016 (GDPR), Data Protection Act 2018 and the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations 2003.

The Association of Ex-Round Tablers' Clubs (41 Club) will treat that personal data fairly, responsibly and in a transparent manner.

To protect our Club and Association status, documents proving your membership eligibility must be kept on file for the duration of your Club/Association Membership. You have the right to request us to delete those documents from your file, by doing so we will not be able to further extend your membership and your membership will be deemed lapsed without refund.
